Latin Name: Foeniculum vulgare

DIGESTION; CLEANSING; LACTATION

Use Whole Plant; Especially SEEDS; Essential Oil

Native to Mediterranean area; India

HISTORY

- Romans: Awarded Fennel Garlands for victorious warriors. Believed to bestow strength, courage, and long life.
- 2) Greek physicians Hippocrates (460-370 BC) and Dioscorides (40-90 AD): PromotES Lactation in Nursing Mothers
- 3) Arabian Medicine: Diuretic; Appetizer; Digestive
- 4) Middle Ages: Ward off EVIL SPIRITS on Midsummer's Eve
- 5) Early 1600s: CULPEPER (British Herbalist): Cleanse the Blood; Open Obstruction of the Liver

QUALITIES

- NUTRIENTS: VITAMINS A (rich source); C; Calcium; Potassium; Sodium; Sulfur OTHER: Volatile Oils
- 2) AROMATIC FLAVORING: CONDIMENT with Fish
- 3) DIGESTION; Hiccups (preventing nausea); Intestinal GAS; Intestinal SPASMS; Indigestion; Children's Indigestion and Sedative; Normal Bowel Function; Expels WORMS; Constipation; Gentle Laxative
- STUDY (laxative): "...treatment of constipation was evaluated in a randomized clinical trial which confirmed their laxative efficacy and safety." (Picon 2010)
- WEIGHT reduction (Curbs Appetite; Alleviates Hunger Pains)
- 4) NURSING MOTHERS: (Poultice) Swelling and Inflammation in nursing mother's breasts; Enriches Quantity and Quality of Milk; Relieves Colic in babies
- STUDY (infant colic): "The use of fennel seed oil emulsion eliminated colic in 65% of infants in the treatment group according to the Wessel criteria, which was superior to placebo 23.7%, in decreasing intensity of infantile colic." (Alexandrovich 2003)
- 5) CLEANSING and ANTISEPTIC:
- KIDNEYS; Diuretic; Breaks down Uric Acid (from protein digestion); Stones; Back Ache; Gout
- Breaks up mucus and phlegm in LIVER; Gall bladder and Liver Cleanser; Tissue Cleanser; Effective cleanser after radiation or chemotherapy
- Breaks up mucu and phlegm in LUNGS; Expectorant; Coughs

6) EYES: Vit A helps alleviate LIGHT SENSITIVITY; Improves NIGHT VISION; Snow Blindness; Eyewash Tea

7) OTHER

- Skin (revitalizing); Wrinkles

CONSTIPATION/ LAXATIVE

The efficacy & safety of the phytotherapic compounds present in Pimpinella anisum L., Foeniculum vulgare Miller, Sambucus nigra L., & Cassia augustifolia used in Brazil for the treatment of constipation was evaluated in a randomized clinical trial which confirmed their laxative efficacy and safety. From Abstract:

Number of evacuations per day increased during the use of active tea; significant differences were observed as of the second day of treatment...Patient perception of bowel function was improved...

INFANT COLIC

The use of fennel seed oil emulsion eliminated colic in 65% (40 out of 62) of infants in the treatment group according to the Wessel criteria, which was superior to placebo 23.7% (14 out of 59) in decreasing intensity of infantile colic. Alexandrovich 2003 From Abstract:

Fennel seed oil has been shown to reduce intestinal spasms and increase motility of the small intestine. A randomized placebo-controlled trial was used to determine the effectiveness of fennel seed oil emulsion in infantile colic in 125 infants, 2 to 12 weeks of age, who met definition of colic.

The use of fennel oil emulsion eliminated colic, according to the Wessel criteria, in 65% (40/62) of infants in the treatment group, which was significantly better than 23.7% (14/59) of infants in the control group...Our study suggests that fennel seed oil emulsion is superior to placebo in decreasing intensity of infantile colic.
